

## Gaining Hours from Regular Sports and Recreation Clubs

Students involved in Children's University Australia can gain their passport hours through a variety of different activities:

**Restricted Learning Destinations** – Those activities hosted by member school exclusively for students of that school (e.g. Lunchtime Activities, School Sports)

**Independent Learning Activities** – Learning tasks students can complete in their own time/space (e.g. School Holiday Challenges, Monthly Challenge)

**Public Learning Destinations** – External organisations which offer validated learning activities for students (e.g. Adelaide Zoo, Bounce Inc, National Railway Museum, Local Councils)

**Regular Restricted Learning Destinations** – External organisations which require students to pay a membership fee and attend on a regular basis (e.g. Sporting Clubs, Dance Clubs, Music Tuition)

In an effort to encourage students to seek out new, unique learning experiences our school has chosen to cap the total amount of hours earned per activity to **10 hours per activity per membership period**.

For the first three types of activities, hours must be entered into the passport after a student participates in- or completes each activity by the individual responsible for hosting the activity. This includes staff at Public Learning Destinations (typically front-of-house staff who have been trained to complete passports). For Independent Learning Activities, it is the school CUA Coordinator who enters the hours in the passport.

In the case of Regular Restricted Clubs, students from our school can gain their hours in a simple manner by completing a 'Review' of their activities each year. Students who participate in such activities can complete the relevant review form obtained from their school CUA Coordinator in order to highlight their learning. Students then return it before graduation to receive 10 hours in their passport. The students can earn another 10 hours for participation in the same activity should they renew their annual membership, and aim for further graduations at higher award levels.
