Kind-on-Purpose


In our whole-school friendship strategy- Friendology, we teach the students how to manage conflict and we define conflict into two categories: Friendship Fires and Mean-on-Purpose behaviour. By teaching students to respond to conflict in a healthy way and stand up to Mean-on-Purpose behaviour, we create cultures of kindness in our school.

The importance of intentional acts of kindness- Studies show that children who exhibit kindness are more socially accepted by peers. In other words, children who are kind are more well-liked and have more friends. Not only that, children who engage in acts of kindness improve their own wellbeing.

We can get even more intentional about creating kindness by introducing students to Kind-on-Purpose and Kind-on-Accident behaviour. We want to teach our students that kindness is a choice and to understand that kindness is a type of behavior marked by acts of generosity, consideration, or concern for others, without expecting praise or reward.

Tips for cultivating kindness:

- 1. Model kindness lead by example and show your children what being kind looks like.
- 2. Notice kindness recognise and praise your children when you notice them being kind.
- Stand up for others if you notice someone is being 'Mean-on- Purpose,' stand up for them. Give them your support and let them know they're not alone.
- Be kind to yourself remember no-one is perfect and sometimes aim for 'good enough' and relax as it is!

The Minister for Education, the Hon John Gardner visited today and got to hear about the work we are doing to take a stand against bullying. He saw our Kids Matter space with the SRC students showing him a range of activities on offer at break times. 
Our NPS Governing Council welcomed its new members at our meeting on 15 March, following the AGM earlier in the term. We are pleased to have Aviv, Gemma and Sam join the Council, and appreciate the years of service from departing members Alec, Jane and Libby.

This year we are all looking forward to getting back into a more regular rhythm of opportunities for our school families to come together. We will be working with our parent class reps to help get us all connected at the classroom and year level and have already seen some great examples with the Easter Egg hunts! We also plan to share dates of key events for us to come together as a full school community over the year – with the Term 2 Art Show in June being the next main event.

This year, from a policy side, the Council will be focussing on the revision of the 'sun smart' policy and the new requirement for a policy around mobile devices. The **sun smart policy** is due for an update under the School's regular policy review cycle. This will be worked on by the Council this year and available to the community later in the year – please feel free to contribute ideas if you are passionate about this topic. The Council had a good discussion around **mobile device policy** considerations that helped us understand the challenges for the School around the increased number of personal mobile devices students are bringing to school, and how they can be managed. We discussed considerations such as the interruptions and distractions to student concentration when mobile devices were in the classroom or playground; the increased desire for some children to have a device for their safety in transit to and from school; plus the complexity of device security, and who is responsible and liable for damage and loss. This is an emerging challenge that all schools need to work out how to manage and the Council expects to hear more as the year goes on.

We look forward to hearing from you about what is important to you about the School and how you'd like to be involved... stay tuned for more on that in Term 2. In the meanwhile, feel free to speak with any of your Governing Council members if you'd like to discuss anything, or just to introduce yourself! We really love being part of the Norwood PS school community and meeting new members.
