Health and Physical Education with Stefan

The Health and Physical Education program delivers 1 lesson a week for each Year 6 class. In term 4, our sporting focus will be on Striking and Fielding activities (Tee-ball). Through this sport and modified activities, students will be refining their fundamental movement skills (FMS) with a strong emphasis on bat object control and ball accuracy. This will then assist students when transitioning to a Game Sense approach to learning. This modified game sense approach allows for greater cognitive development through use of questioning, adapting to rules and space modifications during different activities.

During this term, students will also be undertaking their fourth and final round of fitness testing (The Beep Test) in week 3 of this term.

Textiles, Fashion and Sustainability

This term, Year 6 students will use systems thinking to explore the complexity and sustainability of the textiles and fashion industries. They will consider all aspects of the system, including material selection, sourcing, production, maintenance, and end-of-life, to design products and services that address sustainability concerns.

<u>Technologies students will:</u>

- Assess the problems created or solved by existing products, services, or environments.
- Generate multiple solutions to a single problem and select the best option based on design criteria or constraints.
- Explain their design ideas using digital tools or analogue methods to produce detailed plans, sketches, or models.
- Include sustainability considerations in their design criteria or briefs.
- Consider sustainable resources, such as second-hand fabrics, compostable materials, or renewable energy sources like solar, wind, or hydropower.

- identify, analyse and apply elements of dance for a specific purpose and effect
- explain how the elements of dance, choreographic devices and production elements communicate meaning
- structure dance sequences using elements of dance and choreographic devices
- work collaboratively and individually to choreograph movement sequences
- recognise and use safe dance practices when improvising movement, choreographing, rehearsing and performing
- respond to stimulus through improvising movement
- represent physical objects and props through abstract movement
